## **WOMACK ISSUES STATEMENT REGARDING 2<sup>ND</sup> LT HOLLEY WIMUNC**

FORT BRAGG, N.C. – Following today’s Fayetteville Police Department’s news conference reference 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. Holley Wimunc, Col. Terry Walters, commander, Womack Army Medical Center issued the following statement:

“The Soldiers and civilians of Womack Army Medical Center are pleased with the Fayetteville Police Department's investigation. We are confident they are following every lead and are uncovering the events surrounding this tragedy.

Holley is deeply missed by all of us who had the honor of knowing and working with her. She and her family are in our prayers.”

Wimunc, a 24-year-old nurse assigned to WAMC’s Mother Baby Unit, was officially declared a missing person on July 10 after she did not report for her hospital shift that morning.

Wimunc, a mother of two, earned a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing from St. Ambrose University, Iowa, in 2007, where she was commissioned by the Army Nurse Corps. Fort Bragg was her first duty assignment where she arrived in August 2007.
