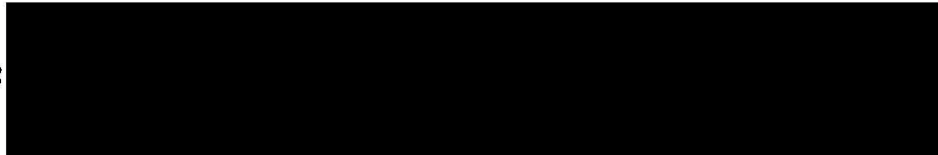




As you answer the questions that follow, please keep in mind that every person is fully entitled to his or her own opinions and feelings, and that there is no right or wrong answers, only complete and incomplete answers. SYNOPSIS

The Defendants have been charged by indictment with the crimes of Conspiracy to Commit a Crime, Conspiracy to Commit Kidnapping, Kidnapping with use of a Deadly Weapon, Conspiracy to Commit Robbery, Robbery with Use of a Deadly Weapon, Burglary while in Possession of a Deadly Weapon, Assault with a Deadly Weapon, and Coercion with use of a Deadly Weapon, alleged to have occurred at the Palace Station Hotel and Casino on September 13, 2007. The defendants have denied all charges and have pleaded Not Guilty.

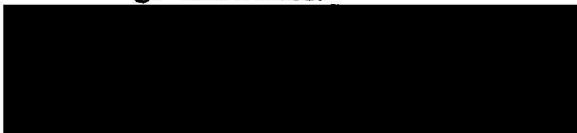
