Re: Complaint against Obama for America

Dear Commissioners:

This letter constitutes a formal complaint filed under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) of the Federal Election Campaign Act ("FECA") on behalf of the Republican National Committee ("RNC"). Based upon information and belief, set forth below and in the attached materials, the RNC believes that Obama for America ("OFA") has violated FECA and the Commission's Regulations by accepting prohibited contributions from foreign nationals and excessive contributions from individuals. The RNC believes that the specific examples below are indicative of a pattern of such violations and requests that the Commission conduct an immediate investigation into the adequacy of procedures to comply with federal election law restrictions on sources and amounts of federal campaign contributions, particularly those that do not require itemization. Based on the Requests for Additional Information ("RFAIs") the Commission has sent to OFA, including a 162 page RFAI, and press reports concerning both foreign national and excessive contributions, including an account in *Newsweek*, there appears to be grounds for a full audit of OFA's receipts in the 2007-2008 Presidential election cycle.

Obama for America Violated FECA by Accepting Prohibited Contributions from Foreign Nationals

Factual Background

Several media reports have recently raised serious questions about OFA's fundraising practices, particularly its lenient procedures for screening contributions from foreign nationals. See generally Exhibits A, D – F. According to a recent Newsmax article, OFA has received more than 11,500 potentially prohibited contributions from foreign nationals, totaling approximately \$33.8 million. See Exhibit A. Presumably the

referenced list of 11,500 would consist entirely of contributions itemized on OFA's FEC reports and would not include the millions of contributions that OFA is not legally required to itemize or disclose.¹ The same media report also alleges that OFA's online donation website did not ask for proof of citizenship until recently² and generally did not thoroughly vet foreign contributions to ensure that they were coming from U.S. citizens living abroad and not from foreign nationals. *Id.*

This report provided several specific examples of questionable fundraising practices involving foreign nationals. For example, a series of pro-Obama fundraisers were held in Nigeria throughout July and August, and although the sponsors claimed they were held to raise money to help Nigerians attend the Democratic National Convention, the Nigerian government was so skeptical of this claim that it is now investigating the matter. *Id.* The Nigerian Economic and Financial Crimes Commission ("EFCC") in late August confiscated 74,100,000 Nigerian Naira (approximately \$630,000) from the "Obama for Africa" campaign, which is a controversial group led by Mrs. Ndi Okereke-Onyuike, Director General of the Nigerian Stock Exchange. *See* Exhibit B. In response to public outrage, the EFCC has opened an investigation and questioned Okereke-Onyuike. *Id.*

According to reports, Libyan leader Moammar Gadhafi publicly stated in a speech that foreign nationals may have made contributions to Obama's campaign. See Exhibits A and C. Foreign nationals were able to buy Obama paraphernalia at OFA's online store by making a contribution to OFA. Through this mechanism, two foreign nationals were able to contribute approximately \$33,000 to OFA in October and November of 2007. See Exhibits A, E – G. These donations appear on OFA's 2007 Year End FEC Report. Although OFA attempted to correct the violation by refunding the prohibited contributions, the Newsmax article claims that FEC records indicate that they have yet to refund the entire amount. See Exhibit A. Further, the news of such violations did not lead the Obama campaign to alter this avenue for potential illegal foreign contributions at the time—OFA apparently has only done so much more recently.

A recent column published in *The American Spectator* states that an FEC analyst believes OFA has accepted millions of dollars in prohibited contributions from foreign nationals. *See* Exhibit D. The FEC analyst, apparently speaking on background, claims that he has brought the matter before his superiors, but they have largely disregarded his requests primarily for political considerations. *Id.*

¹ Notably, the McCain Primary campaign, John McCain 2008, and the McCain GELAC committee disclose the names and addresses of *every* contributor, and make that database computer searchable online. The Obama campaign, however, has steadfastly refused to provide similar disclosure of its unitemized receipts under \$200.

² OFA's website now requires overseas contributors to provide a valid U.S. passport number when donating online. It appears wholly unknown what, if any, control systems OFA had in place before instituting this step.

Analysis

FECA prohibits a foreign national from directly or indirectly making a "contribution or donation of money or other thing of value . . . in connection with a Federal, State, or local election." 2 U.S.C. §441e(a)(1)(A). This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, making contributions to a presidential candidate's campaign committee. Further, federal law also prohibits knowingly providing assistance to a foreign national in the making of such illegal contributions or knowingly accepting or receiving a contribution from a foreign national. 11 C.F.R. § 110.20.

Commission Regulations provide that a person has knowingly provided assistance when that person (1) has "actual knowledge" that the funds are coming from a foreign national; (2) is "aware of facts that would lead a reasonable person to conclude that there is a substantial probability that the source of the funds . . . is a foreign national;" or (3) is "aware of facts that would lead a reasonable person to inquire whether the source of the funds . . . is a foreign national, but . . . fail[s] to conduct a reasonable inquiry." 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(a)(4). Such questionable facts include whether the contributor uses a foreign passport, a foreign address, a foreign bank, or is living abroad. 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(a)(5).

The media reports, *supra*, suggest that only recently, after the receipt of hundreds of millions of dollars in contributions, did OFA put the necessary fundraising compliance practices in place to ensure that contributions from individuals living abroad were actually coming from U.S. citizens and not foreign nationals. The examples in the media reports primarily involve contributions disclosed on FEC reports. The extent to which such prohibited foreign national contributions constitute OFA's unitemized contributions, of course remains entirely unknown. The RNC believes that OFA has (1) accepted prohibited foreign national contributions and (2) knowingly done so through its failure to reasonably investigate questionable contributions originating abroad.

Obama for America Violated FECA by Accepting Excessive Contributions from Individuals

Factual Background

FEC reports indicate, and media accounts highlight, that OFA repeatedly accepts excessive contributions from individuals, including those with obviously fictitious names. See Exhibits A, D-F. The Newsmax article, discussed supra, emphasizes that OFA has a long track record of accepting excessive contributions and then having to either refund or redesignate the contribution. In fact, every single RFAI that OFA has received since its inception questions OFA about possible excessive contributions from individuals.³

³ The RNC notes that the McCain campaign, like most other large-scale committees, has also received numerous RFAIs, some of which question possible excessive contributions. What distinguishes the Obama campaign's RFAIs from other large committees is a pattern of noncompliance. OFA repeatedly did not adequately respond to the RFAIs and did not take immediate corrective action, or even any action within the timeframes required under Commission Regulations.

See Exhibit G. For one report, the RFAI was 162 pages long because the list of excessive contributions was so long. See id. Also concerning is the fact that some of these excessive contributions appear to come from fictitious individuals, such as "Good Will" and "Doodad Pro." See Exhibits A, F.

Newsweek conducted an investigation into the background of these contributors and discovered, rather unsurprisingly, that these are not real individuals. See Exhibit F. "Good Will," whose occupation and employer are, respectively, "Loving" and "You," listed an address in Austin, Texas that belongs to "Goodwill Industries," a nonprofit corporation. Id. Newsweek interviewed a representative from Goodwill Industries who explained that the nonprofit did not know who was responsible for the contributions, but was aware that they were being made and alerted OFA in September about the apparent fraudulent use of its name and address. Id. The address provided for "Doodad Pro" in Nunda, New York is actually that of a liquor store. Id. (According to Newsweek, a representative from the store had never heard of Mr. or Ms. "Doodad," but did note that a nearby "Doodad's Boutique" had closed over a year ago. Id.)

Analysis

FECA clearly states that individuals may contribute a maximum of \$2,300 per candidate per election. 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a)(1)(A), (c). A committee has a duty to examine contributions and, should a committee knowingly accept an excessive contribution, the committee may either refund the excessive portion to the contributor within sixty days or ask the contributor to redesignate the excessive portion to a different election within sixty days. 11 C.F.R. §§ 103.3(b), 110.1(b)(5). Should a committee unknowingly accept an excessive contribution, it has within thirty days of when the illegality is discovered to take such remedial action. *Id.*

OFA's amended FEC reports and responses to the Commission's RFAIs claim that OFA did take action to remedy several excessive contributions, but OFA has failed to refund or reattribute the full excessive portion in all of the situations. See Exhibit A. It is also questionable whether OFA took remedial action within the required timeframes. Presumably most of the excessive contributions should have been knowingly accepted because they were disclosed on the FEC reports. It appears, however, that OFA did not take remedial action until the FEC pointed out the excessive contributions in RFAIs. It also appears that OFA knew about these excessive contributions, yet failed to take remedial action within the required sixty day window, instead waiting until the FEC sent an RFAI. It is possible that OFA was not aware of these excessive contributions until it received the RFAIs, in which case it would have thirty days to take remedial action, which it has failed to do several times. Again, FEC reports indicate that OFA did not refund or reattribute the full excessive portion in all of the situations. The RNC believes that OFA did accept excessive contributions from individuals and did not take remedial action within the statutorily imposed timeframe.

The Commission Should Investigate All of Obama for America's Contributions from Individuals

The RNC requests that the Commission immediately investigate the legality of all of OFA's contributions from individuals, paying particular attention to foreign national contributions and excessive contributions. Given that OFA is not legally required to itemize all contributions, and given that OFA did not accept public funding and is not subject to a mandatory post-election cycle audit, there is approximately \$250 million in contributions from individuals who will otherwise never be disclosed to the American public. See Exhibit A. The RNC believes that widespread illegalities may exist among these unitemized contributions and requests that the Commission immediately investigate both itemized and unitemized contributions to ensure a fair and open election.

Accordingly, the RNC respectfully requests that the Commission conduct an immediate investigation into the violations outlined above, conduct a full audit of OFA's receipts in the 2007-2008 Presidential election cycle, and impose the maximum penalty under law.

The above is correct and accurate to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.


Secret, Foreign Money Floods Into Obama Campaign

More than half of the whopping \$426.9 million Barack Obama has raised has come from small donors whose names the Obama campaign won't disclose.

And questions have arisen about millions more in foreign donations the Obama campaign has received that apparently have not been vetted as legitimate.





But because of Obama's high expenses during the hotly contested Democratic primary season and an early decision to forgo public campaign money and the spending limits it imposes, all that cash has not translated into a financial advantage — at least, not yet.

The Obama campaign and the Democratic National Committee began September with \$95 million in cash, according to reports filed with the Federal Election Commission (FEC).

The McCain camp and the Republican National Committee had \$94 million, because of an influx of \$84 million in public money.

But Obama easily could outpace McCain by \$50 million to \$100 million or more in new donations before Election Day, thanks to a legion of small contributors whose names and addresses have been kept secret.

Unlike the McCain campaign, which has made its complete donor database available online, the Obama campaign has not identified donors for nearly half the amount he has raised, according to the Center for Responsive Politics (CRP).

Federal law does not require the campaigns to identify donors who give less than \$200 during the election cycle. However, it does require that campaigns calculate running totals for each donor and report them once they go beyond the \$200 mark.

Surprisingly, the great majority of Obama donors never break the \$200 threshold.

"Contributions that come under \$200 aggregated per person are not listed," said Bob Biersack, a spokesman for the FEC. "They don't appear anywhere, so there's no way of knowing who they are."

The FEC breakdown of the Obama campaign has identified a staggering \$222.7 million as coming from contributions of \$200 or less. Only \$39.6 million of that amount comes from donors the Obama

campaign has identified.

It is the largest pool of unidentified money that has ever flooded into the U.S. election system, before or after the McCain-Feingold campaign finance reforms of 2002.

Biersack would not comment on whether the FEC was investigating the huge amount of cash that has come into Obama's coffers with no public reporting.

But Massie Ritsch, a spokesman for CRP, a campaign-finance watchdog group, dismissed the scale of the unreported money.

"We feel comfortable that it isn't the \$20 donations that are corrupting a campaign," he told Newsmax.

But those small donations have added up to more than \$200 million, all of it from unknown and unreported donors.

Ritsch acknowledges that there is skepticism about all the unreported money, especially in the Obama campaign coffers.

"We and seven other watchdog groups asked both campaigns for more information on small donors," he said. "The Obama campaign never responded," whereas the McCain campaign "makes all its donor information, including the small donors, available online."

The rise of the Internet as a campaign funding tool raises new questions about the adequacy of FEC requirements on disclosure. In pre-Internet fundraising, almost all political donations, even small ones, were made by bank check, leaving a paper trail and limiting the amount of fraud.

But credit cards used to make donations on the Internet have allowed for far more abuse.

"While FEC practice is to do a post-election review of all presidential campaigns, given their sluggish metabolism, results can take three or four years," said Ken Boehm, the chairman of the conservative National Legal and Policy Center.

Already, the FEC has noted unusual patterns in Obama campaign donations among donors who have been disclosed because they have gone beyond the \$200 minimum.

FEC and Mr. Doodad Pro

When FEC auditors have questions about contributions, they send letters to the campaign's finance committee requesting additional information, such as the complete address or employment status of the donor.

Many of the FEC letters that Newsmax reviewed instructed the Obama campaign to "redesignate" contributions in excess of the finance limits.

Under campaign finance laws, an individual can donate \$2,300 to a candidate for federal office in both the primary and general election, for a total of \$4,600. If a donor has topped the limit in the primary, the campaign can "redesignate" the contribution to the general election on its books.

In a letter dated June 25, 2008, the FEC asked the Obama campaign to verify a series of \$25 donations

from a contributor identified as "Will, Good" from Austin, Texas.

Mr. Good Will listed his employer as "Loving" and his profession as "You."

A Newsmax analysis of the 1.4 million individual contributions in the latest master file for the Obama campaign discovered 1,000 separate entries for Mr. Good Will, most of them for \$25.

In total, Mr. Good Will gave \$17,375.

Following this and subsequent FEC requests, campaign records show that 330 contributions from Mr. Good Will were credited back to a credit card. But the most recent report, filed on Sept. 20, showed a net cumulative balance of \$8,950 — still well over the \$4,600 limit.

There can be no doubt that the Obama campaign noticed these contributions, since Obama's Sept. 20 report specified that Good Will's cumulative contributions since the beginning of the campaign were \$9,375.

In an e-mailed response to a query from Newsmax, Obama campaign spokesman Ben LaBolt pledged that the campaign would return the donations. But given the slowness with which the campaign has responded to earlier FEC queries, there's no guarantee that the money will be returned before the Nov. 4 election.

Similarly, a donor identified as "Pro, Doodad," from "Nando, NY," gave \$19,500 in 786 separate donations, most of them for \$25. For most of these donations, Mr. Doodad Pro listed his employer as "Loving" and his profession as "You," just as Good Will had done.

But in some of them, he didn't even go this far, apparently picking letters at random to fill in the blanks on the credit card donation form. In these cases, he said he was employed by "VCX" and that his profession was "VCVC."

Following FEC requests, the Obama campaign began refunding money to Doodad Pro in February 2008. In all, about \$8,425 was charged back to a credit card. But that still left a net total of \$11,165 as of Sept. 20, way over the individual limit of \$4,600.

Here again, LaBolt pledged that the contributions would be returned but gave no date.

In February, after just 93 donations, Doodad Pro had already gone over the \$2,300 limit for the primary. He was over the \$4,600 limit for the general election one month later.

In response to FEC complaints, the Obama campaign began refunding money to Doodad Pro even before he reached these limits. But his credit card was the gift that kept on giving. His most recent unrefunded contributions were on July 7, when he made 14 separate donations, apparently by credit card, of \$25 each.

Just as with Mr. Good Will, there can be no doubt that the Obama campaign noticed the contributions, since its Sept. 20 report specified that Doodad's cumulative contributions since the beginning of the campaign were \$10,965.

And then there are the overseas donations — at least, the ones that we know about.

The FEC has compiled a separate database of potentially questionable overseas donations that contains more than 11,500 contributions totaling \$33.8 million. More than 520 listed their "state" as "IR," often an abbreviation for Iran. Another 63 listed it as "UK," the United Kingdom.

More than 1,400 of the overseas entries clearly were U.S. diplomats or military personnel, who gave an APO address overseas. Their total contributions came to just \$201,680.

But others came from places as far afield as Abu Dhabi, Addis Ababa, Beijing, Fallujah, Florence, Italy, and a wide selection of towns and cities in France.

Until recently, the Obama Web site allowed a contributor to select the country where he resided from the entire membership of the United Nations, including such friendly places as North Korea and the Islamic Republic of Iran.

Unlike McCain's or Sen. Hillary Clinton's online donation pages, the Obama site did not ask for proof of citizenship until just recently. Clinton's presidential campaign required U.S. citizens living abroad to actually fax a copy of their passport before a donation would be accepted.

With such lax vetting of foreign contributions, the Obama campaign may have indirectly contributed to questionable fundraising by foreigners.

In July and August, the head of the Nigeria's stock market held a series of pro-Obama fundraisers in Lagos, Nigeria's largest city. The events attracted local Nigerian business owners.

At one event, a table for eight at one fundraising dinner went for \$16,800. Nigerian press reports claimed sponsors raked in an estimated \$900,000.

The sponsors said the fundraisers were held to help Nigerians attend the Democratic convention in Denver. But the Nigerian press expressed skepticism of that claim, and the Nigerian public anti-fraud commission is now investigating the matter.

Concerns about foreign fundraising have been raised by other anecdotal accounts of illegal activities.

In June, Libyan leader Moammar Gadhafi gave a public speech praising Obama, claiming foreign nationals were donating to his campaign.

"All the people in the Arab and Islamic world and in Africa applauded this man," the Libyan leader said. "They welcomed him and prayed for him and for his success, and they may have even been involved in legitimate contribution campaigns to enable him to win the American presidency..."

Though Gadhafi asserted that fundraising from Arab and African nations were "legitimate," the fact is that U.S. federal law bans any foreigner from donating to a U.S. election campaign.

The rise of the Internet and use of credit cards have made it easier for foreign nationals to donate to American campaigns, especially if they claim their donation is less than \$200.

Campaign spokesman LaBolt cited several measures that the campaign has adopted to "root out fraud," including a requirement that anyone attending an Obama fundraising event overseas present a valid U.S.

passport, and a new requirement that overseas contributors must provide a passport number when donating online.

One new measure that might not appear obvious at first could be frustrating to foreigners wanting to buy campaign paraphernalia such as T-shirts or bumper stickers through the online store.

In response to an investigation conducted by blogger Pamela Geller, who runs the blog Atlas Shrugs, the Obama campaign has locked down the store.

Geller first revealed on July 31 that donors from the Gaza strip had contributed \$33,000 to the Obama campaign through bulk purchases of T-shirts they had shipped to Gaza.

The online campaign store allows buyers to complete their purchases by making an additional donation to the Obama campaign.

A pair of Palestinian brothers named Hosam and Monir Edwan contributed more than \$31,300 to the Obama campaign in October and November 2007, FEC records show.

Their largesse attracted the attention of the FEC almost immediately. In an April 15, 2008, report that examined the Obama campaign's year-end figures for 2007, the FEC asked that some of these contributions be reassigned.

The Obama camp complied sluggishly, prompting a more detailed admonishment form the FEC on July 30.

The Edwan brothers listed their address as "GA," as in Georgia, although they entered "Gaza" or "Rafah Refugee camp" as their city of residence on most of the online contribution forms.

According to the Obama campaign, they wrongly identified themselves as U.S. citizens, via a voluntary check-off box at the time the donations were made.

Many of the Edwan brothers' contributions have been purged from the FEC database, but they still can be found in archived versions available for CRP and other watchdog groups.

The latest Obama campaign filing shows that \$891.11 still has not been refunded to the Edwan brothers, despite repeated FEC warnings and campaign claims that all the money was refunded in December.

A Newsmax review of the Obama campaign finance filings found that the FEC had asked for the redesignation or refund of 53,828 donations, totaling just under \$30 million.

But none involves the donors who never appear in the Obama campaign reports, which the CRP estimates at nearly half the \$426.8 million the Obama campaign has raised to date.

Many of the small donors participated in online "matching" programs, which allows them to hook up with other Obama supporters and eventually share e-mail addresses and blogs.

The Obama Web site described the matching contribution program as similar to a public radio fundraising drive.

"Our goal is to bring 50,000 new donors into our movement by Friday at midnight," campaign manager

David Plouffe e-mailed supporters on Sept. 15. "And if you make your first online donation today, your gift will go twice as far. A previous donor has promised to match every dollar you donate."

FEC spokesman Biersack said he was unfamiliar with the matching donation drive. But he said that if donations from another donor were going to be reassigned to a new donor, as the campaign suggested, "the two people must agree" to do so.

This type of matching drive probably would be legal as long as the matching donor had not exceeded the \$2,300 per-election limit, he said.

Obama campaign spokesman LaBolt said, "We have more than 2.5 million donors overall, hundreds of thousands of which have participated in this program."

Until now, the names of those donors and where they live have remained anonymous — and the federal watchdog agency in charge of ensuring that the presidential campaigns play by the same rules has no tools to find out.

This is the farce of democracy for you. He says: 'This was propaganda, and you thought I was being serious. I was fooling you to get your votes."

"We still hope that this black man will take pride in his African and Islamic identity, and in his faith, and that [he will know] that he has rights in America, and that he will change America from evil to good, and that America will establish relations that will serve it well with other peoples, especially the Arabs."

The analyst, who declines to be identified for fear of retribution, says that on four different occasions in the past three months, he sought to open formal investigations into the Obama campaign's fundraising techniques, but those investigations have been discouraged. "Without formal approval, I can't get the resources I need, manpower, that kind of thing. This is a huge undertaking." And the analyst says that he believes that campaign finance violations have occurred.

The Obama campaign has already had to deal with several FEC complaints about fraudulent donors and illegal loreign contributions, and the FEC says it has no record that those complaints have been resolved or closed. As well, the Obama campaign has been cagey at times about the means by which it has made its historic fundraising hauls, which now total almost \$500 million for the election cycle. The Hillary Clinton campaign raised questions about the huge amount of e-retail sales the Obama campaign was making for such things as t-shirts and other campaign paraphernalia, and how such sales were being tracked and used for fundraising purposes. While the profits of those items counted against the \$2,300 personal donation limit, there have always been lingering questions about the e-retail system.

"The question has always been, if you buy a \$25 t-shirt and you go back to that purchaser eight or nine times with email appeals for \$200 or \$500 donations, and you have people donating like that all the time, at what point does the campaign bother to check if the FEC limit has been exceeded?" says a former Clinton campaign fundraiser. "There are enough of us from the 1992 and 1996 and 2000 races around to know that many of these kinds of violations never get caught until after the election has been won or lost. In this case, there is no way the Obama campaign will be held accountable before Election Day, unless someone raises holy hell."

The FEC analyst says that Obama's filings indicate he has received large, bundled sums of donations from overseas, sometimes exceeding a quarter millions dollars. "It's suspicious, but it's the small donations made by credit card that need to be examined. We've raised red flags on many of these and the Obama campaign just ignores us. After this election, after we've sifted through everything -- if we're allowed to sift through everything -- I am confident that we are looking at perhaps the largest fine every leveled against a national campaign entity.

Just as frustrating as the lack of desire on the part of his bosses to act, says the analyst, is that major media outlets have ignored the story he has been attempting to tell. Thus far, Newsmax is one of the few publications to cover the Obama campaign finance scam story.

Obama's Funny Money, or Who's "Loving" "You," Barry? [Andy McCarthy] Mr. "Good Will," apparently.

My pal Diana West points me to Ken Timmerman's must-read Newsmax column -which naturally is getting no coverage in the MSM - about Sen. Obama's eyepopping fundraising operation. Bottom line: the would-be President of the World is raising goo-gobs of money from foreigners outside the United States (a violation of federal law), and matching goo-gobs of money inside the United States from phantoms who are blowing out the individual contribution limits by, among other devices, making up identies and breaking up contributions in amounts less than \$200, for which reporting requirements are less rigorous.

According to Ken, the Obama campaign has raised nearly half a billion dollars (\$429.6M) but refuses to provide the names of most of the donors. Election law requires the campaign to track this information but not for it to disclose the names of those who donate less than \$200, which is most Obama donors. (Sen. McCain discloses the names of all donors.) The Obama campaign has raised millions upon millions of dollars from outside the United States. Only Americans living overseas may lawfully contribute, but because the Obama vetting machinery is negligent (or worse), the probability is that enormous sums are coming from foreigners. The campaign knows the FEC is a lethargic agency and won't have a full accounting until perhaps years after the election.

This typifies the domestic fundraising issue:

In a letter dated June 25, 2008, the FEC asked the Obama campaign to verify a series of \$25 donations from a contributor identified as "Will, Good" from Austin, Texas. Mr. Good Will listed his employer as "Loving" and his profession as "You."

A Newsmax analysis of the 1.4 million individual contributions in the latest master file for the Obama campaign discovered 1,000 separate entries for Mr. Good Will, most of them for \$25. In total, Mr. Good Will gave \$17,375.

Following this and subsequent FEC requests, campaign records show that 330 contributions from Mr. Good Will were credited back to a credit card. But the most recent report, filed on Sept. 20, showed a net cumulative balance of \$8,950 still well over the \$4,600 limit.

There can be no doubt that the Obama campaign noticed these contributions, since Obama's Sept. 20 report specified that Good Will's cumulative contributions since the beginning of the campaign were \$9,375.

In an e-mailed response to a query from Newsmax, Obama campaign spokesman Ben LaBolt pledged that the campaign would return the donations. But given the slowness with which the campaign has responded to earlier FEC queries, there's no guarantee that the money will be returned before the Nov. 4 election

Similarly, a donor identified as "Pro, Doodad," from "Nando, NY," gave \$19,500 in 786 separate donations, most of them for \$25. For most of these donations, Mr. Doodad Pro listed his employer as "Loving" and his profession as "You," just as Good Will had done. But in some of them, he didn't even go this far, apparently picking letters at random to fill in the blanks on the credit card donation form. In these cases, he said he was employed by "VCX" and that his profession was

Following FEC requests, the Obama campaign began refunding money to Doodad Pro in February 2008. In all, about \$8,425 was charged back to a credit card. But that still left a net total of \$11,165 as of Sept. 20, way over the individual limit of \$4,600. Here again, LaBolt pledged that the contributions would be returned but gave no date.

In February, after just 93 donations, Doodad Pro had already gone over the \$2,300 limit for the primary. He was over the \$4,600 limit for the general election one month later. In response to FEC complaints, the Obama campaign began refunding money to Doodad Pro even before he reached these limits. But his credit card was the gift that kept on giving. His most recent un-refunded contributions were on July 7, when he made 14 separate donations, apparently by credit card, of \$25 each.

Just as with Mr. Good Will, there can be no doubt that the Obama campaign noticed the contributions, since its Sept. 20 report specified that Doodad's cumulative contributions since the beginning of the campaign were \$10,965.

Bear in mind that we only know about Messrs. "Good Will" and "Doodad Pro" because someone detected that they went over \$200 in aggregate contributions. If more clever Obama supporters have given thousands of dollars to Obama by structuring it in a variety of different phony names and amounts under \$200, we might not learn about that for years ... if ever.

And then there is the foreign money. A sampling from Ken — though all of it should be read (italics are mine):

The FEC has compiled a separate database of potentially questionable overseas donations that contains more than 11,500 contributions totaling \$33.8 million. More than 520 listed their "state" as "IR," often an abbreviation for Iran. Another 63 listed it as "UK," the United Kingdom.

More than 1,400 of the overseas entries clearly were U.S. diplomats or military personnel, who gave an APO address overseas. Their total contributions came to just \$201,680. But others came from places as far afield as Abu Dhabi, Addis Ababa, Beijing, Fallujah, Florence, Italy, and a wide selection of towns and cities in France.

Until recently, the Obama Web site allowed a contributor to select the country where he resided from the entire membership of the United Nations, including such friendly places as North Korea and the Islamic Republic of Iran. Unlike McCain's or Sen. Hillary Clinton's online donation pages, the Obama site did not ask for proof of citizenship until just recently

In July and August, the head of the Nigeria's stock market held a series of pro-Obama fundraisers in Lagos, Nigeria's largest city. The events attracted local Nigerian business owners. At one event, a table for eight at one fundraising dinner went for \$16,800. Nigerian press reports claimed sponsors raked in an estimated \$900,000. The sponsors said the fundraisers were held to help Nigerians attend the Democratic convention in Denver. But the Nigerian press expressed skepticism of that claim, and the Nigerian public anti-fraud commission is now investigating the matter.

"All the people in the Arab and Islamic world and in Africa applauded this man," the Libyan leader said. "They welcomed him and prayed for him and for his success, and they may have even been involved in legitimate contribution campaigns to enable him to win the American presidency...'

[O]n July 31 that donors from the Gaza strip had contributed \$33,000 to the Obama campaign through bulk purchases of T-shirts they had shipped to Gaza.... A pair of Palestinian brothers named Hosam and Monir Edwan contributed more than \$31,300 to the Obama campaign in October and November 2007, FEC records show. Their largesse attracted the attention of the FEC almost immediately. In an April 15, 2008, report that examined the Obama campaign's year-end figures for 2007, the FEC asked that some of these contributions be reassigned. The Obama camp complied sluggishly, prompting a more detailed admonishment form the FEC on July 30. The Edwan brothers listed their address as "GA," as in Georgia, although they entered "Gaza" or "Rafah Refugee camp" as their city of residence on most of the online contribution forms.... The latest Obama campaign filling shows that \$891.11 still has not been refunded to the Edwan brothers, despite repeated FEC warnings and campaign claims that all the money was refunded in December.

A Newsmax review of the Obama campaign finance filings found that the FEC had asked for the redesignation or refund of 53,828 donations, totaling just under \$30 million.

But none involves the donors who never appear in the Obama campaign reports, which the [Center for Responsive Politics] estimates at nearly half the \$426.8 million the Obama campaign has raised to date.

Obama's 'Good Will' Hunting

The Obama campaign has shattered all fund-raising records, raking in \$458 million so far, with about half the bounty coming from donors who contribute \$200 or less. Aides say that's an illustration of a truly democratic campaign. To critics, though, it can be an invitation for fraud and illegal foreign cash because donors giving individual sums of \$200 or less don't have to be publicly reported. Consider the cases of Obama donors "Doodad Pro" of Nunda, N.Y., who gave \$17,130, and "Good Will" of Austin, Texas, who gave more than \$11,000—both in excess of the \$2,300-per-person federal limit. In two recent letters to the Obama campaign, Federal Election Commission auditors flagged those (and other) donors and informed the campaign that the sums had to be returned. Neither name had ever been publicly reported because both individuals made online donations in \$10 and \$25 increments. "Good Will" listed his employer as "Loving" and his occupation as "You," while supplying as his address 1015 Norwood Park Boulevard, which is shared by the Austin nonprofit Goodwill Industries. Suzanha Burmeister, marketing director for Goodwill, said the group had "no clue" who the donor was. She added, however, that the group had received five puzzling thank-you letters from the Obama campaign this year, prompting it to send the campaign an e-mail in September pointing out the apparent fraudulent use of its name.

"Doodad Pro" listed no occupation or employer; the contributor's listed address is shared by Lloyd and Lynn's Liquor Store in Nunda. "I have never heard of such an individual," says Diane Beardsley, who works at the store and is the mother of one of the owners. "Nobody at this store has that much money to contribute." (She added that a Doodad's Boutique, located next door, had closed a year ago, before the donations were made.)

Obama spokesman Ben LaBolt said the campaign has no idea who the individuals are and has returned all the donations, using the credit-card numbers they gave to the campaign. (In a similar case earlier this year, the campaign returned \$33,000 to two Palestinian brothers in the Gaza Strip who had bought T shirts in bulk from the campaign's online store. They had listed their address as "Ga.," which the campaign took to mean Georgia rather than Gaza.) "While no organization is completely protected from Internet fraud, we will continue to review our fundraising procedures," LaBolt said. Some critics say the campaign hasn't done enough. This summer, watchdog groups asked both campaigns to share more information about its small donors. The McCain campaign agreed; the Obama campaign did not. "They could've done themselves a service" by heeding the suggestions, said Massie Ritsch of the Center for Responsive Politics.
