### PROBABLE STARTERS

#### SF RUDY GAY

- Averaging a team-high **19.0 points** (T-13<sup>th</sup> in the NBA) through his first **six** career playoff games, scoring 20-or-more points **three** times.
- Posted a team-high **19.0 points** (17<sup>th</sup> in the NBA), a career-high 6.4 rebounds and 1.46 steals (16<sup>th</sup>) in a team-high 37.3 minutes (8<sup>th</sup>) during the regular season
- Played in 65 of the 66 regular season games following last year's season-ending left shoulder injury.
- Scored a season-high 32 points on April 11 vs. Phoenix, the Grizzlies' first and only 30-point game this season.
- Ranked seventh in the NBA in dunks (110) this season and was the only player with at least 110 dunks and 50 three-pointers made.

- Averaged **11.0 points** and **8.3 rebounds** in 26.0 minutes in 24 regular season games after returning from a 37-game absence due to a torn right MCL suffered on Jan. 1 at Chicago.
- 2010-11 All-NBA Third Team Selection (career first and franchise first) after averaging 20.1 points and a franchise-record 12.2 rebounds (3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA) in 75 games last season.

## PREVIOUS GAMES

### NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 6 – MEMPHIS 90, LA CLIPPERS 88, May 11 at STAPLES Center

**Memphis, Tenn.** – After Memphis fans chanted “See You Sunday” at the close of a Game 5 victory at FedExForum, the Memphis Grizzlies ensured there would be a Game 7 on Sunday with a come-from-behind win over the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 6 at STAPLES Center... The Clippers looked to clinch the series after scoring 10 unanswered points to open the fourth quarter, taking a 76-68 lead with 8:31 remaining in the fourth quarter... But the Grizzlies responded by reeling off 10-straight points of their own as part of a 17-4 run that was capped by a **Zach Randolph** tip-in off a missed layup... Randolph, who recorded 18 points and hauled in 16 rebounds, followed on the next possession with a dunk in traffic to put the finishing touches on a 15-point, 10-rebound second half... Frontcourt partner **Marc Gasol** scored 23 points to lead the team in scoring for a second consecutive game... **Rudy Gay** and **Mike Conley** each scored 13, with Conley making all three of the Grizzlies’ treys... **Blake Griffin** led the Clippers with 17 points, while **Chris Paul** totaled 11, his lowest output of the series... The win ensured the Grizzlies of a home Game 7 for the first time in franchise history.

### NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 5 – MEMPHIS 92, LA CLIPPERS 80, May 9 at FedExForum

**Memphis, Tenn.** – The Memphis Grizzlies rediscovered their identity and stayed alive in the 2012 NBA Playoffs, defeating the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 5 of their first-round series and closing the series game to 3-2... Memphis made 15-of-21 shots (.714) and poured in 36 points in the first quarter, tying the most points by the franchise in any quarter in a playoff game and marking the Grizzlies’ highest first-quarter output of the season... **Marc Gasol** and **Zach Randolph** combined to score 27 points in the opening frame, as Memphis recorded 24 points in the paint before the start of the second quarter... The Grizzlies would go on to dominate the paint, 48-26, and win the rebounding battle, 42-35... The Clippers were limited to .371 shooting overall, including a .292 clip from three-point range... Gasol led the team with a playoff season-high 23 points, while Randolph would record his first double-double of the 2012 Playoffs with 19 points and 10 boards... Memphis saw its 24-point lead sliced to six (85-79) with 55.7 seconds remaining, but **Rudy Gay**’s driving lay-up with 19.1 seconds left highlighted the Grizzlies’ 7-1 run to seal the win... **Mo Williams** led Los Angeles off the bench with a playoff season-high 20 points... **Chris Paul** finished with 19 points, while **Blake Griffin** posted a double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds... The Grizzlies won for the seventh time in their last nine home playoff games, each of which have been sellouts.

### NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 4 – LA CLIPPERS 101, MEMPHIS 97 (OT), May 7 at STAPLES Center

**Memphis, Tenn.** – The Memphis Grizzlies overcame a 10-point deficit with just over four minutes in regulation to force overtime, but Chris Paul’s eight points in the extra period were enough to power Los Angeles to a 101-97 victory in game three of the series... Memphis trailed 84-74 with 4:31 left in the game before reeling off an 11-1 run to tie at 85 on a **Rudy Gay** jumper at the 35 second mark... Paul made a driving layup on the next Los Angeles possession, but **Zach Randolph** countered with two free throws for Memphis to force overtime... **Mike Conley**’s layup with 10 seconds left in overtime brought the Grizzlies within 99-97, but **Mo Williams** made two free throws to puts the Clippers ahead 101-97 with under 10 seconds to play... Gay missed a 26-foot three point attempt on the final Memphis possession to ice the game for Los Angeles... Conley finished with a playoff career-high 25 points to go along with seven rebounds and eight assists... **Blake Griffin** led the Clippers with 30 points while Paul added 27 including eight in overtime... Gay finished with 23 points, including six of the team’s 11 points during the 11-1 fourth quarter run... Randolph finished just one rebound short of a double-double, grabbing nine boards and scoring 12 points.

### Connections:

Grizzlies forward **Zach Randolph** played in 39 games (34 starts) with the Clippers in 2008-09, posting 20.9 points, 9.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 35.1 minutes per game... Memphis acquired Randolph from the Clippers in exchange for Quentin Richardson on July 17, 2009... Clippers assistant **Marc Iavaroni** served as the head coach of the Grizzlies for one-and-a-half seasons (2007-09), compiling a 33-90 (.268) record with the club... Grizzlies assistant coach **David Joerger** came to Memphis as a member of Iavaroni's staff... Grizzlies Head Coach **Lionel Hollins** played one season for the San Diego Clippers in 1982-83, averaging 13.5 points, 2.3 rebounds and 6.7 assists in 56 games (54 starts)... Grizzlies guard **O.J. Mayo** attended USC and averaged 20.7 points, 3.3 assists and 1.6 steals, setting school freshman records for scoring average, points scored (684) and three-point field goals made (88) in his lone season with the Trojans (2007-08)... Grizzlies guard **Tony Allen** and Clippers forward **Ryan Gomes** were teammates with the Boston Celtics for two seasons from 2005-07... Grizzlies General Manager **Chris Wallace** drafted Gomes in the second round (50<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2005 NBA Draft as the GM of the Celtics... Wallace also served as a scout for the Clippers during the 1990-91 season... Grizzlies Limited Partner and radio color analyst **Elliot Perry** was originally drafted in the second round (37<sup>th</sup> overall) by the Clippers in the 1991 NBA Draft and averaged 1.3 points and 1.4 assists in 6.6 minutes in 10 games with the team... Grizzlies assistant **Barry Hecker** served as the Los Angeles Clippers' Director of Player Personnel from 1986-94 and as an assistant coach from 1994-98... Hecker returned to the Clippers in both roles from 2001-05... Grizzlies assistant **Henry Bibby**, a UCLA alum, served as the head coach at USC from 1996-04 and was the Los Angeles Sparks' head coach in 2005... Grizzlies radio color analyst **Hank McDowell** played one season (1983-84) with the San Diego Clippers and averaged 3.6 points in 57 games... Grizzlies television analyst **Brevin Knight** played one season (2007-08) with Los Angeles, averaging 4.6 points, 4.4 assists and 1.9 rebounds in 22.6 minutes in 74 games (39 starts).

**2011-12 Playoff Game Stories:**

**NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 1 – LA CLIPPERS 99, MEMPHIS 98, April 29 at FedExForum**

**Memphis, Tenn.** – The Memphis Grizzlies got off to a promising start to their second consecutive postseason campaign, but saw a 24-point fourth-quarter lead evaporate as the Los Angeles Clippers and stole Game 1 of the first-round series in FedExForum... Memphis dominated the first three quarters of the game, leading by as many as 27 points at two different points in the third quarter... But after an **O.J. Mayo** three-pointer put the Grizzlies up by 24 (95-71) with 9:13 remaining in the fourth, the Clippers rallied back with a furious 26-1 run to take their first lead of the game with 50.3 seconds on the clock... Seven Grizzlies combined to misfire on 12 consecutive shots, while Memphis committed four turnovers and got outrebounded 16-3 during the Clippers' 28-3 run that finished the game... Though **Rudy Gay** connected on a 10-foot jumper to put the Grizzlies back in the lead (98-97) with 28.4 seconds left, **Chris Paul** was fouled seconds later and made two free throws... Memphis would miss at the buzzer in its first home loss since March 16 vs. Toronto... The Grizzlies entered the game on a franchise-record tying 11-game regular season home winning streak... Gay finished with a team-high 19 points in his NBA Playoffs debut, while Mayo had 17 off the bench... **Mike Conley** scored 17 points and made all of his five three-point attempts, as Memphis shot 11-of-16 (.688) from downtown but just 11-of-18 (.611) from the free throw line... Conley tied **Mike Miller's** single-game franchise record for three-pointers in a playoff game... **Marc Gasol** finished with 14 points and six assists but attempted just one shot in the second half... **Nick Young** led the Clippers with 19 points in reserve and made three-straight three-pointers in a 60-second span starting with 2:47 left in the game... All three of those corner triples were assisted by **Chris Paul**, who had a game-high 11 assists... The Grizzlies led by 18 after the first quarter, 19 at halftime and 21 after the third... The Clippers' comeback after being down 21 points entering the fourth quarter tied the largest in NBA Playoff history.

**NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 2 – MEMPHIS 105, LA CLIPPERS 98, May 2 at FedExForum**

**Memphis, Tenn.** – Following a heartbreaking loss in Game 1, the Memphis Grizzlies played inspired basketball in the fourth quarter to even their first-round series with the Los Angeles Clippers at one game apiece... After a competitive first quarter, Memphis took the lead (39-37) midway through the second quarter and this time never gave it up... Though Los Angeles would threaten to replicate its Game 1 comeback, cutting the margin to four points (83-79) with 8:06 remaining in the fourth quarter, the Grizzlies responded with a 14-5 run to build the advantage to 13 (97-84), their largest of the game... **O.J. Mayo** scored 10 of his playoff career-high 20 points in the final frame, while **Rudy Gay** led the team in scoring with 21... **Mike Conley** served as the closer, making 7-of-8 free throws in the fourth quarter and finishing with 19 points (4-of-11 FG, 11-of-12 FT), while **Zach Randolph** had 15, including a sweeping hook-and-one to put the Grizzlies up by double digits in the fourth... **Marreese Speights** (11 points) and **Tony Allen** (10) also scored in double figures... Memphis defeated Los Angeles despite the Clippers' .567 shooting... The Grizzlies recorded 13 steals and forced LA into 21 turnovers, scoring 25 points off the miscues... **Chris Paul** led all scorers with 29 points, while **Blake Griffin** added 22 points and nine rebounds... Memphis sold out its eighth consecutive home playoff game.

**NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 3 – LA CLIPPERS 87, MEMPHIS 86, May 5 at STAPLES Center**

**Memphis, Tenn.** – **Rudy Gay** made two three-pointers to stage a late Memphis rally, but a last-second chance for the win fell short, as the Los Angeles Clippers took another dramatic one-point win and a 2-1 lead in the best-of-seven series... As it did in Game 1, Memphis shut down Los Angeles through the first three quarters, outscoring the Clippers 25-14 in the third to take a 71-64 advantage into the final quarter... However, offensive rebounding sparked the Clippers' comeback with 4:35 remaining in the game... With Memphis leading by six (79-73), **Eric Bledsoe** grabbed an errant **Chris Paul** jumper and stuck it back in, plus the foul, for a three-point opportunity... Bledsoe missed the free throw, which was then snagged and put in by **Reggie Evans**, cutting the Grizzlies' six-point lead to two in just five seconds... The sequence sparked a 13-1 run by the Clippers to go up 86-80 with 23.0 seconds left on the clock... Gay nearly spoiled Los Angeles' comeback, sinking consecutive treys while the Clippers missed their final five free throw attempts... Los Angeles missed 17 of its 30 attempts from the foul line, the worst percentage (.433) in NBA Playoffs history by a team with at least 30 attempts... After being outrebounded 32-23 through the first three quarters, the Clippers outboarded the Grizzlies 12-8 in the final frame... Gay scored a playoff career-high 24 points and made 12 of his 15 free throw attempts... **Zach Randolph** added 17 points, while **Marc Gasol** posted a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds... Paul finished with 24 points and 11 assists, complemented by 17 points from **Blake Griffin**... **Randy Foye** added 16 for the Clippers, while Evans corralled six of his 11 rebounds in the fourth quarter.

**NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 4 – LA CLIPPERS 101, MEMPHIS 97 (OT), May 7 at STAPLES Center**

**Memphis, Tenn.** – The Memphis Grizzlies overcame a 10-point deficit with just over four minutes in regulation to force overtime, but Chris Paul's eight points in the extra period were enough to power Los Angeles to a 101-97 victory in game three of the series... Memphis trailed 84-74 with 4:31 left in the game before reeling off an 11-1 run to tie at 85 on a **Rudy Gay** jumper at the 35 second mark... Paul made a driving layup on the next Los Angeles possession, but **Zach Randolph** countered with two free throws for Memphis to force overtime... **Mike Conley's** layup with 10 seconds left in overtime brought the Grizzlies within 99-97, but **Mo Williams** made two free throws to puts the Clippers ahead 101-97 with under 10 seconds to play... Gay missed a 26-foot three point attempt on the final Memphis possession to ice the game for Los Angeles... **NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 5 – MEMPHIS 92, LA CLIPPERS 80, May 9 at FedExForum**

**Memphis, Tenn.** – The Memphis Grizzlies rediscovered their identity and stayed alive in the 2012 NBA Playoffs, defeating the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 5 of their first-round series and closing the series game to 3-2... Memphis made 15-of-21 shots (.714) and poured in 36 points in the first quarter, tying the most points by the franchise in any quarter in a playoff game and marking the Grizzlies' highest first-quarter output of the season... **Marc Gasol** and **Zach Randolph** combined to score 27 points in the opening frame, as Memphis recorded 24 points in the paint before the start of the second quarter... The Grizzlies would go on to dominate the paint, 48-26, and win the rebounding battle, 42-35... The Clippers were limited to .371 shooting overall, including a .292 clip from three-point range... Gasol led the team with a playoff season-high 23 points, while Randolph would record his first double-double of the 2012 Playoffs with 19 points and 10 boards... Memphis saw its 24-point lead sliced to six (85-79) with 55.7 seconds remaining, but **Rudy Gay's** driving lay-up with 19.1 seconds left highlighted the Grizzlies' 7-1 run to seal the win... **Mo Williams** led Los Angeles off the bench with a playoff season-high 20 points... **Chris Paul** finished with 19 points, while **Blake Griffin** posted a double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds... The Grizzlies won for the seventh time in their last nine home playoff games, each of which have been sellouts.

**NBA PLAYOFFS, ROUND 1, GAME 6 – MEMPHIS 90, LA CLIPPERS 88, May 11 at STAPLES Center**

**Memphis, Tenn.** – After Memphis fans chanted "See You Sunday" at the close of a Game 5 victory at FedExForum, the Memphis Grizzlies ensured there would be a Game 7 on Sunday with a come-from-behind win over the Los Angeles Clippers in Game 6 at STAPLES Center... The Clippers looked to clinch the series after scoring 10 unanswered points to open the fourth quarter, taking a 76-68 lead with 8:31 remaining in the fourth quarter... But the Grizzlies responded by reeling off 10-straight points of their own as part of a 17-4 run that was capped by a **Zach Randolph** tip-in off a missed layup... Randolph, who recorded 18 points and hauled in 16 rebounds, followed on the next possession with a dunk in traffic to put the finishing touches on a 15-point, 10-rebound second half... Frontcourt partner **Marc Gasol** scored 23 points to lead the team in scoring for a second consecutive game... **Rudy Gay** and **Mike Conley** each scored 13, with Conley making all three of the Grizzlies' treys... **Blake Griffin** led the Clippers with 17 points, while **Chris Paul** totaled 11, his lowest output of the series... The win ensured the Grizzlies of a home Game 7 for the first time in franchise history.

## 2012 PLAYOFFS QUICK FACTS

### TEAM QUICK FACTS

- One year ago, the Memphis Grizzlies became just the second eight-seed in NBA history to defeat a one-seed (San Antonio) in a best-of-seven playoff series... This year, Memphis will seek to become the ninth team ever to come back from a 3-1 deficit to win a seven-game series.
- Memphis has sold out **10** consecutive home playoff games dating back to Game 3 of the first round during the 2011 Playoff run... This afternoon's Game 7 with the Los Angeles Clippers went on-sale at 10 a.m. Saturday following the team's Game 6 win in Los Angeles and sold out in less than five minutes, setting a team record... The Grizzlies have won seven of their last nine home playoff games.
- This afternoon marks the first time in franchise history that the Memphis Grizzlies will host a Game 7... Memphis took Oklahoma City to seven games in its last playoff series in the 2011 Western Conference Semifinals.
- This afternoon's Game 7 marks just the third time the Grizzlies have been featured on ABC and their first home game on network television... Memphis was on ABC twice during the 2011 conference semifinal series with the Oklahoma City Thunder (Game 1 and Game 7, both in OKC).
- Despite the first round series with the Clippers being tied **3-3**, the Grizzlies actually lead the scoreboard **568-553**.
- Memphis is **2-1** in elimination games dating back to last season's playoffs.
- **Zach Randolph** and **Marc Gasol** each had big first quarters in helping the Grizzlies stay alive in Game 5... Randolph made all six field goal attempts and scored 15 points, while Gasol added 12 points, as Memphis scored 36 points in the first quarter, the team's highest first-quarter output of the entire season.
- The Grizzlies' 36 first-quarter points in Game 5 tie the franchise's most points in any quarter in a playoff game (Game 4 vs. Phoenix on May 1, 2005).
- The Grizzlies clinched the fourth seed in the Western Conference, the highest seed ever for the team, and is hosting a playoff series for the first time in franchise history.
- Memphis made the playoffs for a second consecutive season and qualified for the postseason in five of their 11 seasons in the Bluff City (2004, 2005, 2006, 2011, 2012).
- The Grizzlies' Game 1 home loss the Clippers was the team's first home defeat since March 16 vs. Toronto... The team had entered the postseason riding a franchise-record tying 11-game home winning streak.

### PLAYER QUICK FACTS

- **Marc Gasol** has averaged 23.0 points and 8.0 rebounds on .567 shooting in the last two games, helping Memphis come back from a 3-1 deficit to tie the first round series with the Clippers... Memphis is **6-1** all-time when Gasol scores 16-or-more points in a playoff game (**4-8** when scoring under 16).
- **Zach Randolph** scored 18 points and snagged 16 rebounds in Memphis' Game 6 victory over the Clippers... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Randolph is averaging 20.8 points and 11.6 rebounds in eight career games in which his team faced playoff elimination... Only four other active players are averaging at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in potential elimination games (minimum: 2 such games played): **Caron Butler** (21.9 points per game/10.0 rebounds per game), **Tim Duncan** (22.4/11.9), **Dwight Howard** (20.3/14.3) and **Dirk Nowitzki** (28.9/11.4).
- In his first NBA playoffs, **Rudy Gay** leads the Grizzlies in scoring, averaging **19.0** points for the playoffs (**T-13<sup>th</sup>** in the NBA).
- **Mike Conley** ranks **third** in the league during the postseason in assists (**7.5**) and **fourth** in three-point percentage (**.533**)... Conley, who scored a playoff career-high 25 points in Game 4 on May 7 at LA Clippers, is also averaging **15.8** points
- During the NBA Playoffs, **Mike Conley** has made over twice as many three-pointers as any player above him on the three-point percentage leaderboard.
- **Mike Conley** tied a franchise record by making five three-pointers in Game 1 of the first round on April 29 vs. LA Clippers (**Mike Miller**, April 24, 2005 at Phoenix)... Conley also became the first Grizzlies player ever to go perfect from long range and the first since **Peja Stojakovic** last season for the Mavericks (6-of-6 3FG, May 8, 2011 vs. LA Lakers).
- **Marc Gasol** scored a playoff season-high 23 points in Game 5 of the first round on May 9 vs. LA Clippers, exactly one year after he poured in a playoff career-high 26 points in the triple-overtime Game 4 in the 2011 conference semifinals against the Oklahoma City Thunder... Gasol followed up with another 23-point performance in Game 6.
- **O.J. Mayo** scored a playoff career-high 20 points off the bench in Game 2 of the first round on May 2 vs. LA Clippers.
- **O.J. Mayo** netted 10 of his 20 points in the fourth quarter of Game 2, making that the **eighth** time this season he has scored in double figures in the final frame... The Grizzlies have gone **7-1** this season when Mayo scores 10-or-more in the fourth quarter.

### GASOL'S SCORING MARCS PLAYOFF WINS FOR MEMPHIS

Though **Marc Gasol** is one of the game's best-passing big men, Memphis has found playoff success when he is aggressive scoring the ball... The Grizzlies are **6-1** all-time when Gasol scores at least 16 points in a playoff game and **4-8** when he scores under 16.

### BELIEVE (AGAIN) MEMPHIS...

Despite numerous obstacles along the way, Memphis grinded its way to its second consecutive postseason berth, posting an even better regular season record than in 2010-11... The Grizzlies captivated the nation during the 2011 Playoffs, knocking off the top-seeded San Antonio Spurs as an eight seed and then taking the Oklahoma City Thunder to seven games a conference semifinal series that saw a triple-overtime game in Game 4 at FedExForum... The second eight seed to topple a one seed in a seven-game series (Golden State over Dallas, 2007), Memphis won its first seven postseason games in franchise history and sold out all six home playoff contests at the Forum last season... Here is a look at some key comparisons and tidbits from this season and each of the three previous playoff years.

#### "TRAIN" IS THE GRIZZLIES' CONDUCTOR

The fierce competitiveness and intensity of Grizzlies Head Coach **Lionel Hollins** has been a perfect match in the City of Memphis, and under Hollins, the Grizzlies have achieved unprecedented success... The "L-Train" led the 2011-12 Grizzlies to their best season ever by winning percentage (.621), and guided the Grizzlies to the club's first seven postseason wins during the 2011 NBA Playoffs... The winningest head coach in franchise history, Hollins had Memphis leading the league in steals (9.6) and forced turnovers (17.1) this year for the second-straight season, as the Grizzlies became the first NBA team to lead the league in both categories in consecutive seasons since the 1995-96 and 1996-97 Seattle SuperSonics.

## 2011-12 REGULAR SEASON QUICK FACTS

### TEAM QUICK FACTS

- Memphis set a franchise record for winning percentage (.621), topping the previous record from the 2003-04 season (.610)... The Grizzlies also won 26 of their 33 home games (.788), the fifth-highest mark in the NBA and the best in franchise history (.756 in 2003-04).
- The Grizzlies finished the season on an 11-game home winning streak, tying the club record that was set from Dec. 18, 2009-Jan. 25, 2010... Memphis' last regular season home loss came in overtime on March 16 vs. Toronto... The Grizzlies' final regular season home loss in regulation came two-and-a-half months ago on Feb. 12 vs. Utah.
- Memphis finished above its pace from last season, when the Grizzlies finished 46-36 (.561) in the regular season before their 2011 Playoffs run... Since he was tabbed as head coach in January 2009, **Lionel Hollins** has improved the team's regular season record each year every year.
- Memphis ended the regular season 16 games above .500 for the first time since the end of the 2005-06 regular season, when the Grizzlies finished 49-33 under head coach Mike Fratello.
- The Grizzlies won 11 of their final 13 games and 16 of their last 20, including road wins against the Western Conference-leading Oklahoma City Thunder, Southeast Division-leading Miami Heat and Pacific Division-leading Los Angeles Lakers.
- The Grizzlies finished the season 12-6 on the front end of a back-to-back set and had an even better record (13-5) in the second game... These numbers do not include back-to-back-to-backs.
- The Grizzlies have recorded a winning record in eight of the past nine months, with the only exception being December 2011 (1-2)... Before this current nine-month stretch, the franchise had never put together four consecutive winning months – now they've done it twice.
- The Grizzlies posted 36.1 points off the bench in the final 18 games (28.8 through the team's first 49 games).
- The Grizzlies missed 123 games due to injury or illness this season, *surpassing the number of games the team sustained in all of the 2010-11 season (96)*.
- Under head coach Lionel Hollins, Memphis has become one of the most feared defensive units in the league... The Grizzlies topped the NBA in steals (9.6) and forced turnovers (17.1) after leading each category last season, becoming the first team to lead the league in both steals per game and forced turnovers per game for consecutive seasons was the 1995-96 and 1996-97 Seattle SuperSonics.
- The Grizzlies went a perfect 13-0 in the regular season when shooting .500 from the field and 17-3 when scoring 100 points in a game... Two of those three losses were in overtime.
- Memphis outscored New Orleans 37-12 in the third quarter in a win on April 18, recording the largest point differential in a single quarter in franchise history.
- Memphis has been one of the NBA's best front-runners at home this season... When at FedExForum, the Grizzlies are 17-1 when leading at the end of the first quarter and have a 16-1 record with the lead going into halftime... The only loss came in double overtime, 116-111, on March 13 vs. LA Lakers.
- Memphis earned wire-to-wire victories on April 6 at Miami and April 7 vs. Dallas, not only defeating both teams who appeared in the 2011 NBA Finals on consecutive nights but never trailing for a second in doing so... The Grizzlies became the first team to record victories over the defending Eastern and Western Conference champions on consecutive nights since the 2003-04 Indiana Pacers did so over the San Antonio Spurs and New Jersey Nets from Jan. 16-17, 2004.
- Memphis earned consecutive one-point home victories by tipping in the winning basket in the closing seconds from Feb. 17-18, *becoming the first and only team in NBA history to record one-point home victories on consecutive nights*.

**PLAYER QUICK FACTS**

- In the final game of the regular season, **Mike Conley** tied Shane Battier for second on the Grizzlies’ all-time steals list (523)... Battier recorded 523 steals in 419 games, while Conley reached that total in 357 games with Memphis... Rudy Gay passed Battier for the top spot on the chart on Feb. 2 at Atlanta.
- **Rudy Gay** averaged 22.0 points and 6.5 rebounds on .509 shooting in 36.4 minutes in the final 10 games... Gay enters his first-ever postseason after missing last year’s run due to a shoulder subluxation.
- **Rudy Gay** has scored 20-plus points in 32 of the last 56 games played after doing so just once in the team’s first nine contests... Memphis stood 24-9 this season when Gay reached 20 points, including his season-high 32 point outburst on April 11 vs. Phoenix.
- Making a strong case for his first career NBA All-Defense selection, Mike Conley has set a franchise record for steals per game (career-high 2.19)... That mark ranks second in the NBA this season (Chris Paul).
- In 20 games with **Zach Randolph** coming off the bench, the Grizzlies reserves averaged 36.1 points.
- Memphis went a remarkable 23-14 when Zach Randolph was sidelined with a torn right MCL and was 24-14 without Randolph in the lineup this season.
- **O.J. Mayo** scored 17 of his 20 points in the fourth quarter in a win over Utah on April 14, the most points in a single quarter by any Grizzlies player this season... Mayo scored in double figures in the fourth quarter seven times this season (6-1 record).
- The Grizzlies were a perfect 8-0 this season when **Mike Conley** reaches 20 points.
- **Tony Allen** set a franchise record and career high with eight steals on April 23 vs. Cleveland, tying the most by any NBA player in a single game this season... Allen broke the old club record of seven, which had been reached seven times, most recently by Mike Conley on Oct. 30, 2010 vs. Minnesota.
- **Tony Allen** is averaging a career-high tying 1.79 steals per game (5<sup>th</sup> in the NBA) in his second season with the Grizzlies, equaling the mark he set last season (1.79) en route to making the NBA All-Defense Second Team in his first season in Memphis.
- **O.J. Mayo** scored double figures off the bench 47 times this season, including a season-high 24 points on March 31 at Milwaukee... All other Grizzlies have reached double figures in a reserve role a combined 39 times.
- The Grizzlies went 37-17 with Marreese Speights in the starting lineup.
- Marc Gasol earned his first All-Star nod when he was named to the 2012 Western Conference All-Star Team as a reserve on Feb. 9... Gasol, one of two first-time All-Stars in the West this season (**LaMarcus Aldridge**), is averaging career highs this season in points, rebounds, assists, blocks and minutes.
- **Mike Conley** recorded multiple steals in a franchise-record and career-high 14 consecutive games from Feb. 15-March 18, which is also the longest stretch in the NBA this season and tied for the longest such run since the start of the 2008-09 season (**Rajon Rondo**).

**HOUSE OF BLUES**

FedExForum was the “House of Blues” for Grizzlies opponents this season... Memphis went 26-7 at the Forum this season (.788), recording the best home winning percentage in franchise history (.756, 31-10 in 2003-04)... The Grizzlies tied for the third-best winning percentage at home in the NBA, behind only Miami and San Antonio... Only the Spurs (twice), Thunder (twice), Utah Jazz, Lakers (2OT) and Toronto Raptors (OT) left Memphis with a victory this season... Memphis did not lose at home *in regulation* after Valentine’s Day loss to Utah.

With a record of 41-25 (.621), Memphis enjoyed its most prosperous season in franchise history, by percentage, and continued its upward climb in the NBA landscape since hiring Head Coach **Lionel Hollins**... Coach Hollins has improved the team’s final record in every season since taking the reins in January 2009\*... Despite a condensed 66-game slate, Memphis still recorded at least 40 victories for a third consecutive season, only the second time the team has ever accomplished the feat.

### GRIZZLIES BEAT HEAT; CHOMP CHAMPS

Not only did Memphis defeat Miami and Dallas – both teams who made the 2011 NBA Finals – on consecutive nights (April 6-7), but the Grizzlies never trailed for a single second in either game! The Heat and Mavericks averaged just 11.0 points in the first quarter of those games against the Grizzlies defense... The Grizzlies became the first team to defeat the defending Eastern and Western Conference champions on consecutive nights since the 2003-04 Indiana Pacers knocked off the San Antonio Spurs and New Jersey Nets from Jan. 16-17, 2004.

### SHOWING TEETH ON THE ROAD

Over a two-week span, the Memphis Grizzlies picked up marquee road wins over the Los Angeles Lakers (March 25 at STAPLES Center), Oklahoma City Thunder (April 2 at Chesapeake Energy Arena) and Miami Heat (April 6 at American Airlines Arena)... *Not only is Memphis the only team this season to beat the Lakers, Thunder and Heat in their own buildings, there is only one other NBA team (Houston Rockets) with a win in even two of those three venues.*

### ELIAS SAYS: GRIZZLIES COOL OFF HEAT

The Heat never led in its 97-82 loss to the Grizzlies on Friday night – only the third game in **LeBron James'** two seasons with the team, and the first home game, in which Miami never led... Memphis's victory was totally decisive... The Grizzlies not only scored more points, but they had higher shooting percentages than did the Heat from the field, from beyond the arc and from the line... They also had more rebounds, more assists, more blocked shots and fewer turnovers than the Heat... *It's the first time in LeBron's NBA career in either the regular season or the playoffs that his team (Cleveland or Miami) has lost a home game in which its opponents held the advantage in all eight of those categories.*
