BOB CAMERON

Q. Tell us about your great round today.

BOB CAMERON: It was a fighting round. I think that was the thing. I managed to keep getting it up-and-down. I had five up-and-downs out of six bunkers.

So that tells you maybe my striking wasn't really as good as it should have been, but just tried to keep concentrating and I knew that the scoring was going to be high, so the better I could do, the higher I would finish.

Q. I think 70 right now is the second or third best score of the guys that have come in. There's only been one guy under par. So great score. What did you do after yesterday to get it going today?

BOB CAMERON: Didn't over complicate anything at all. I just tried to keep it simple and obviously I struggled yesterday, maybe that was due to playing such great players as Tom. I think and the way I finished up watching what he was doing rather than focusing on my own golf.

And today I had a better focus like I did in the first two rounds. I just wish I could have -- wishing is no difference, but, no, I think that was the main difference.

Q. How would you sum up your week? Enjoyable?

BOB CAMERON: Tremendous. Absolutely tremendous. It's not often you get your picture on the front page of the local sports page, which I happened to get it on the first day after making a comical action on the 18th.

But everything's been fabulous. The crowds have been wonderful and so appreciative. So it's great to come over and play. We would like to come over more often. So, yeah, that's just the system and you have to play better just to make it.

PERRY ARTHUR

Q. Who you did you play today?

PERRY ARTHUR: I shot 75, which that's probably about 2- or 3-under par for me.

Q. So what are your impressions on playing as such a prestigious course as Oak Hill?

PERRY ARTHUR: I loved it. It was tough and you had to play good golf to score well and that means hitting the ball in the right places. And the course is a Major Championship. And that's the way it ought to be.

Q. How has the course changed over the last couple days, it's sunny and warm today, how has that affected your game?

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PERRY ARTHUR: The last couple days have been a little more playable than the first two. The wind's laid down a little bit. It's made it a little bit easier, but I wouldn't say a whole lot easier.

Q. What do you take away from a Major Championship like this?

PERRY ARTHUR: As we get older you don't know how many more of these you're going to be able to get in, especially as a club pro. So I just savor the experience every time and hopefully this isn't the last one.

GARY ROBISON.

Q. Can you talk about your overall experience here at Oak Hill?

GARY ROBISON: Great golf course. Unless you're hitting it solid and hitting the fairway, you know, it's hard to finish. As you can see.

Q. What did you think just generally about your round today as compared to the rest of the week?

GARY ROBISON: Front side I played pretty good. And was going pretty good on the back side and I 3-putted 12 and then I didn't drive it in the fairway on 14.

I went bogey, bogey, bogey, double bogey, bogey. So and I just, I couldn't put it in the fairway. So that's, if you don't, that's what you get.

Q. Anything else bad?

GARY ROBISON: No, just it was fun. It was fun. I'm glad it's over.

ROBERT THOMPSON

Q. Can you talk about your experience at Oak Hill, your impressions of the golf course?

ROBERT THOMPSON: Great golf course. Very penal with the rough. And the greens are very challenging. A lot of subtle breaks and overall really, no question, very much a championship golf course.

Q. Talk about your round today and what did you see out there?

ROBERT THOMPSON: I thought it played a little bit easier today because the wind laid down and I just couldn't take advantage of it. I shot 7-over. 4-over on the front and 3-over on the back.

And I drove the ball pretty well, but just the greens I think three or four times I missed from the fairway and that really hurts out here. You have to take advantage of it when you're in the fairway.

DARRELL KESTNER

Q. The score is not the best, but a PGA Championship, a Major, you got to be taking something out of this.

DARRELL KESTNER: Oh, yeah, it's always fun to play in the Majors. Play with the guys you kind of watch all your life.

And my goal is to make the cut, I made the cut and didn't play well on the weekend, and, but so it's always a pleasure. And this is such a beautiful golf course that it's a memory I'll always have.

Q. What are you going to try to improve on, knowing what this course gave to you and what aspects of your game you really found out about yourself?

DARRELL KESTNER: After making the cut you still have to kind of, you got two more days of golf and I really, even though I shot 79 yesterday, I really didn't play much differently. The putter just abandoned me there. And on this golf course if the putter doesn't save you two or three times you lose your momentum and it's very difficult.

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
