- The Lakers finished the regular season ranked second in the G League in three-point percentage (.387), third in field goal percentage (.480) and fourth in assists per game (25.6)
- Travis Wear became the 20th member of the South Bay Lakers organization to receive an NBA Call-Up when he signed a 10-day contract with Los Angeles on March 2. Wear signed with LA for the rest of the season on March 23, 2018
- Andre Ingram signed with the Los Angeles Lakers for the rest of the season on April 9, 2018. Ingram received his first NBA Call-Up as the G League's all-time leader in three pointers made with 713 across his career.
- Thomas Bryant finished second in Rookie of the Year and Alex Caruso and Demarcus Holland finished second and third, respectively, in Defensive Player of the Year voting.
- Bryant was named to the All-NBA G League First Team and the NBA G League All-Rookie Team, while Caruso was named to the All-NBA G League Second Team

RECAP: The South Bay Lakers were eliminated from the playoffs as they fell to the Austin Spurs, 104-93, on Thursday night. Gary Payton II led the Lakers with 28 points, nine rebounds, three steals and five blocks. Derrick White finished with 35 points to lead the Spurs. Austin took a slight 27-24 lead into the second quarter as Nick Johnson scored 10 points in the opening frame. Payton II led the Lakers with 13 first quarter points to keep his team close. The two teams went into the half tied at 51, as White led Austin with 17 first half points. The Spurs pulled away in the third to take a 78-68 lead through three. Olivier Hanlan led the Spurs with 10 points in the frame and South Bay shot only 19.0 percent in the period as they fell behind. The Lakers never stopped fighting, but ultimately could not come back for the win. Payton II's double-double paced the Lakers and Alex Caruso, appearing in his third game in three days, added 20 points off the bench. Thomas Bryant tallied a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds as Scott Machado did a little bit of everything with nine points, eight rebounds and six assists. The South Bay Lakers finished the year with a 28-22 regular season record. Coby Karl won the team's first Coach of the Month award in November and Travis Wear became the 20th member of the organization to receive an NBA Call Up when he signed with the Los Angeles Lakers. Thomas Bryant finished second in Rookie of the Year voting, while Alex Caruso and Demarcus Holland finished second and third, respectively, in Defensive Player of the Year.

LAKERS²

Alex Caruso and Gary Payton II suited up for the Lakers in the South Bay and in Los Angeles. The two guards were signed to two-way contracts and were able to spend time between the NBA and G League.

Alex Caruso

Appeared in 37 games for LAL, averaging 3.6 points and 2.0 assists. Caruso ended the regular season with career high in points (15), rebounds (7) and three pointers (3). The two-way guard had his best all-around game against the Knicks with nine points, four rebounds, eight assists and two steals on 1/21/18. Caruso made his Los Angeles debut on opening night, tallying two points and a pair of assists in 12 minutes

Gary Payton II

Payton II appeared in 11 games for LAL, averaging 3.5 points and 2.5 rebounds. He finished the year with a career-best performance, tallying his first double-double with 25 points and 12 rebounds, both career highs. Payton II made his Los Angeles debut on 1/15 at Memphis, playing the entire fourth quarter and posting four points and four assists.

SOUTH BAY'S FINEST

The NBA G League announced their end-of-season awards on 4/16 and South Bay was well represented amongst the recipients. Los Angeles Lakers rookie center Thomas Bryant was named to the All-NBA G League First Team as well as the NBA G League All-Rookie Team. Two-way guard Alex Caruso was named to the All-NBA G League Second Team.

'DRE DAY

- Andre Ingram made his NBA debut on 4/10, scoring 19 points (6-8 FG, 4-5 3FG), with three rebounds and a professional career-high three blocks.
- His 19 points were the most by a Laker in their debut since Nick Van Exel (23) in 1993, while his four three-pointers were the most ever in a Lakers debut
 - Ingram received his first NBA Call-Up on 4/9, after shooting a G League-leading 47.5 percent from three-point range for the South Bay Lakers
 - Andre played in 384 G League games over 10 seasons, with career averages of 10.2 points (.464 FG%, .461 3P%), 3.1 rebounds and 1.6 assists
 - The G League's all-time leader in made three's (713) has shot 45 percent or better from three in eight of his 10 G League seasons

ANDRE 700

Andre Ingram grabbed another milestone in his illustrious career as he hit his 700th three-pointer in South Bay's 108-104 win over the Agua Caliente Clippers. Ingram, the all-time leader in three pointers made, finished the game 4-5 from beyond the arc to improve his total to 703 threes made in his eight year career. Ingram finished the season with 713 career three pointers and is shooting an astounding 46.1 percent of his shots from beyond the arc in his career.

PICK UP THE PHONE TRAVIS

Travis Wear became the 20th member of the South Bay Lakers organization to receive an NBA Call-Up when he signed a 10-day contract with the Los Angeles Lakers on March 2. Wear signed with Los Angeles for the rest of the season on March 23, 2018. Wear made his LAL debut on 3/3 in LA's 116-112 win in San Antonio with seven points and two rebounds in 13 minutes. In 13 games with Los Angeles, Wear averaged 4.4 points and 2.2 rebounds in 13.4 minutes per game.

DO THE HUSTLE

Michael Holyfield picked up season highs in points (14) and rebounds (14) and Scott Machado led the way with 23 points and nine assists as the Lakers beat Memphis, 125-116. South Bay outscored the Hustle, 32-14, in fast break points, and outscored them by 14, 54-40, in PITT. Robert Heyer also reached a career-high with 19 points.

GREAT SCOTT!

Scott Machado finished the regular season ranked second in the league (8.6) in assists per game. South Bay's engine tallied a career-high 18 assists on 3/3 vs. OKL, the second most assists in a single game in South Bay history. Machado notched his first career triple-double in South Bay's 123-118 win over the Northern Arizona Suns on 1/31. Machado scored 16 points to go along with 10 rebounds and 17 assists.

A WIN FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

The South Bay Lakers picked up their biggest win in team history when they beat the Texas Legends, 155-114, on Monday 2/12. The margin of victory bested the previous mark of 40 points that was set on 1/30/12 in a 127-87 win over the Canton Charge. In the historic win, South Bay set season highs in rebounds (60), assists (38), blocks (11), bench points (68), points in the paint (82) and fast break points (51).

CAPTAIN AMERICA

Travis Wear was chosen to participate for the USA's World Cup Qualifying first round, second-window games. Wear was also chosen to represent Team USA as part of the 12-man roster in November.

- Wear helped the US to an 83-75 win over Puerto Rico with two points, nine rebounds and an assist in 25 minutes and in an 84-48 win over Cuba on 2/23, Wear pitched in six points and four rebounds to help his team to the victory.
- Wear finished with six points and two rebounds in the NBA G League International Challenge as Team USA beat Team Mexico, 88-67, on Sunday 2/18.
- In his first stint with Team USA, Wear averaged 10.5 points and 7.0 rebounds while contributing to two USA wins.

CASE OF THE MONDAYS

The South Bay Lakers finished the season a perfect 4-0 when they played on Mondays. The Lakers won their Monday contests by an average of 19.3 points including wins of 41 and 21 points.

A-WEAR-D SEASON

Travis Wear was named the NBA G League Player of the Week for games played Monday Jan. 29 through Sunday Feb 4. Wear averaged 24.5 points, 13.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists while shooting 57.6 percent from the field and 50.0% from three-point range. The UCLA alum scored 24 points and grabbed a career-high 17 rebounds as South Bay beat NAS, 133-108, on 1/31. Wear followed that performance with 25 points and nine rebounds in a victory at SLC on 2/2. Overall for the week, South Bay outscored its opponents by an average of 21.0 points with Wear on the court.

MIDSEASON MARVELS

Thomas Bryant and Alex Caruso were named to the Midseason All-NBA G League Midseason Team as recognition of their performances in the first half of the season. Bryant and Caruso were selected by league coaches, general managers and players as two of twelve Western Conference players recognized. Bryant tallied 11 games with 20+ points, including four 30-point games while Caruso notched career-highs of 41 pts, 13 ast and 7 steals in the first half of the season.

HOTTER THAN THE SUNS

The South Bay Lakers put together their most complete win of the season on 1/31 as they beat the Suns, 133-108, in a game that saw them lead by as many as 39 points and set season highs in rebounds (58) and assists (36).

- Demarcus Holland scored a career-high 19 points along with nine rebounds in 33 minutes
- Travis Wear grabbed a career-high 17 rebounds with 24 points as South Bay outrebounded NAS 58-44
- Stephau Branch snatched a career-high six steals as South Bay nabbed 14 steals on the night
- Robert Heyer dished a career-high six assists and played a career-best 31 minutes in the win

GP II-III

Two-way guard Gary Payton II grabbed his first career triple-double in South Bay's big win over the Windy City Bulls on Friday 1/26. Payton finished his first South Bay game with 14 points, 12 rebounds and a career-high 11 assists in 28 minutes of action. The triple-double marked the first for the South Bay franchise since Josh Magette grabbed 25 points, 10 rebounds and 15 assists on 2/25/17 vs. Santa Cruz.

NO BULL

The Los Angeles Lakers and South Bay Lakers both beat the Bulls on Friday, January 26 as Los Angeles beat Chicago, 108-103, and South Bay beat Windy City, 129-116. Two-way guard Alex Caruso finished with eight points, four rebounds and three assists in the LA win while Ivica Zubac tallied 25 points, eight rebounds and five blocks for South Bay. Eight South Bay Lakers scored in double figures while LA outscored Chicago by 22 in points in the paint.

MAKING THEIR CASE

South Bay went undefeated at the 2018 Showcase as they beat the Lakeland Magic, 94-86, behind 22 points and eight assists from Alex Caruso and a double-double from Travis Wear. The Lakers opened the 2018 Showcase with a 20-point win over the Long Island Nets. Seven Lakers scored in double-figures as the Lakers never lost their lead. With the sweep, South Bay improved to 11-10 all time at the annual showcase. Caruso was also named to the All-Showcase Second Team.

CARUSHOW

Alex Caruso posted career numbers left and right this season. He tied his career-high of seven steals on 12/19 at Delaware. On 12/17 vs. Memphis, Caruso dished out a career-high 13 assists in South Bay's 137-132 win. He also had a career-night on 12/8 vs. Sioux Falls as he posted career-highs in points (41) and assists (12) to go along with eight rebounds and three steals as South Bay came back from a 15-point deficit to grab the 139-135 overtime win.

SHOW ME WHAT ZU GOT

Ivica Zubac continued his strong play in his second year with South Bay as he scored a career-high 28 points on 12/22 at Canton. He scored 26 points in back-to-back games, 12/19 at Delaware and 12/17 vs. Memphis. Zubac appeared in 14 games with South Bay this season, averaging 21.7 points, 9.1 rebounds and 2.2 blocks per game.

TOP 10 FOR NUMBER 10

Nine-year veteran of the G League and South Bay Lakers mainstay, Andre Ingram moved into the G League's top ten all time scoring on 12/30 with four points in front of his home crowd. Ingram finished the season as the league's fifth all-time leading scorer with 3,901 career points.

LAL-SBL

Two Los Angeles Lakers assignees made their season debuts for South Bay against the Iowa Wolves on 11/15. Ivica Zubac, who played 14 games with the team last year, scored a then-career-high 23 points to go along with nine rebounds, three assists and three steals, while Josh Hart scored 18 points in his first G League game. The pair of assignees followed up their strong debuts on 11/18 at Austin as Hart tallied 17 points, six rebounds and three assists, while Zubac posted a double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds.

3.J. BEACHEM

V.J. Beachem tied a franchise record on 11/24 at Texas when he hit eight three pointers in South Bay's 125-112 win as he scored a career-high 30 points. Beachem (8-10) became the first Laker to hit eight threes in a game since Gerald Green did so on 2/6/12 vs. Erie. Beachem joins Green and Brian Chase (4/3/07 vs. Albuquerque) as the only Lakers to accomplish this feat.

SEVENTH HEAVEN

Alex Caruso etched his name in the South Bay record books on Saturday, 11/18 as he nabbed a career-high seven steals in Austin. His seven steals tie him for most in a game by any player in South Bay history. Caruso achieved the feat again on 12/19 at Delaware. The feat was last achieved by Josh Magette on 12/22/15 at Santa Cruz.

HONOR ROLL

South Bay Lakers head coach Coby Karl was named the G League Coach of the Month for the Month of November. Under Karl, the Lakers shot 52.0% from the field and 46.4% from three, both marks that led the league. South Bay averaged the second-most points, 121.0, and the third-most assists, 24.0, while also posting the highest offensive rating (113.7) in the league. The award is the first of Karl's career and the first such award in franchise history.

BACK-TO-BACKS

The Lakers played eight sets of back-to-back games this year, one less than they had during the 2016-17 season.

SCHEDULE QUIRKS

- The longest road trip of the season was 10 days/four games between December 19-28. SBL went 1-3 on the trip.
- The longest home stand of the season is 15 days/six games between February 24-March 10. SBL went 3-3 in the homestand.
- South Bay played 16 of their 24 home games on Friday, Saturday or Sunday.
- South Bay played all G League opponents at least once, with the exception of the Fort Wayne Mad Ants, Grand Rapids Drive and Wisconsin Herd.

TEXAS-SIZED VICTORY

South Bay's 63.9% shooting performance in their win at Texas, was their highest of the season and only .004 away from their franchise record. Their performance is the best shooting performance in the G League this season.

LAKERS SEE DUB IN HOME OPENER

In the first regular season game at the UCLA Health Training Center, the Lakers erased a 20-point Santa Cruz lead, to win 127-123. South Bay was led by Thomas Bryant (30 points, 8 rebounds), Alex Caruso (career-high 29 points, 7 assists) and Scott Machado (19 points, 8 assists).
